This scene whispers to our hearts: peace begins in the smallest hands, and even one act of kindness can defy the loudest noise of war.»

Association Comment:

The child Hidha Fatima presented a moving painting that shows that peace is born from the simplest actions, even amidst destruction and suffering. The child feeding the pigeons amidst the ruins conveys a profound humanitarian message: that giving and compassion can be the seeds of life in the face of the harshness of war. This participation deeply embodies that hope does not die, and that our shared humanity is the path to true peace. The painting is a creative artistic work that combines the power of the idea and the sincerity of the scene, where the child skillfully employed symbols to reflect the contrast between the cruelty of war and the innocence of childhood. The painting reveals the ability of art to be a witness to pain and a message of hope at the same time.

Association Comment:

The painting of the little girl Dia highlights the power of child art in conveying the most complex truths: that war only produces fear and destruction, while peace builds hope and brings people together on the values of compassion and equality. She has simply managed to encapsulate in half of the painting the meaning of division and inhumanity, and in the other half the meaning of joy and unity, presenting a powerful visual message that transcends words and affirms that a safe future begins by instilling a culture of peace in the minds and hearts of children.


Name: Amna Mani Muhammad Saif Al-Qubaisi Age: 8 years Nationality: Emirati


Her message:

Through simple colors and sincere words, Maahib expressed the dream of all children: to live in a world sheltered by love and unity, where humanity blossoms like the colors of the spectrum.

Association Comment:

Meanwhile, the features of a human figure in the shadow next to the cage embody the moment of anticipation and waiting for freedom. With dark colors transitioning to brightness, Lamar presented a story of transition from suffering to liberation, making a single bird a symbol of an entire people's journey towards freedom, emphasizing that peace means opening the horizon to hope, and that freedom is the first step of humanity towards a better tomorrow.

This contribution demonstrates an early awareness of the importance of linking environmental protection with the promotion of a culture of peace, as Hanan affirmed that preserving the planet begins with spreading values of compassion and love among people, successfully conveying that peace is not just a human concept but a guarantee of the beauty of nature and the continuity of life, and a message that protecting the environment is an integral part of safeguarding global peace.
